(Answers: 1. Jehu; Jehu was to kill the house of Ahab to avenge the prophets, and kill Jezebel. The dogs would eat Jezebel and there would be none to bury her; they took their garments and put them under Jehu on the stairs, blew the trumpet and said Jehu is king; 2. Ahab's; drew a bow, killing Jehoram and had him cast into the field of Naboth; because God saw the blood of Naboth and said He would requite him in that plat; Jezebel painted her face, put on her crown, and called out to Jehu. He asked who was on his side calling for her men to throw her down. They did, he trode her under his horse, went to get something to drink, sent men back to bury her but the dogs had eaten her an all that was left was her skull, her feet, and the palms of her hands; 3. seventy; to take the heads of Ahab's 70 sons and bring them to Jezreel; they killed Ahab's 70 sons and put their heads in baskets and sent them to Jezreel; none of the words God spoke against Ahab fell to the ground, for Jehu did them all; 4. Jehu gathered all of the worshipers of Baal into the house of Baal, set guards to make sure no one escaped, killed them all, and burned all of the images of Baal; 5. destroyed Baal out of Israel; God promised Jehu's children to the fourth generation would sit on the throne; Jehu did not turn from the sins of Jeroboam who made Israel to sin by the golden calves in Bethel and Dan, and he did not walk in the law of the Lord; 6. Jehoahaz; 7. he did evil in the sight of the Lord; the anger of the Lord was kindled against Israel and He delivered them into the hands of their enemies; they departed not from the sins of Jeroboam and the groves remained)
