(Answers: 1. Menahem went to Samaria, smote Shallum, killed him, and reigned in his stead; he was a bad king; 2. Pekahiah; he was a bad king; 3. Pekah, one of his captains, conspired against him, smote him, killed him, and reigned in his room; Pekah; he was a bad king; 4. Hoshea made a conspiracy against Pekah, smote him, slew him, and reigned in his stead; Hoshea; 5. the servant of the king of Assyria; the king of Assyria put Hoshea in prison because he found conspiracy in Hoshea for sending messengers to So the king of Egypt and not giving the king of Assyria a present as he had done year by year; the king of Assyria besieged Samaria for three years, took Samaria, and carried away the Israelites to Assyria; 6. Israel had sinned against God, feared other gods, walked in the statutes of the heathen, did secretly those things that were not right against the Lord, built high places; set up images and groves, burnt incense in the high places, served idols; No; God removed them out of his sight — all but Judah, God rejected all the seed of Israel, afflicted them, and delivered them into the hand of spoilers 7. because Jeroboam I drove Israel from following the Lord, and made them sin a great sin; 8. God sent lions among them which killed some of them; 9. they feared the Lord and served their own gods; they were to not fear other gods, nor bow to them, nor serve them, nor sacrifice to them, but they were to fear the Lord who brought them up out of the land of Egypt and worship Him)
