Answers:

1. He did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, but not with a perfect heart

2. he brought the gods of the children of Seir, and set them up *to be* his gods, and bowed down himself before them, and burned incense unto them; the anger of the LORD was kindled against Amaziah, and he sent unto him a prophet

3. Why have you sought after the gods of the people, which could not deliver their own people out of your hand?; I know that God hath determined to destroy you, because you have done this, and have not hearkened unto my counsel

4. Sent messengers to Jehoash, king of Israel, saying, Come, let us look one another in the face; Israel defeated Judah and they fled every man to their tents; they made a conspiracy against him in Jerusalem, he fled to Lachish, but they went and slew him there

5. Uzziah; he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father Amaziah did

6. he sought God in the days of Zechariah, and as long as he sought the LORD, God made him to prosper; God helped him against the Philistines, the Arabians, and the Mehunims and the Ammonites gave gifts to Uzziah: and his name spread abroad, for he strengthened himself exceedingly

7. when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his destruction, for he transgressed against the LORD his God, and went into the temple of the LORD to burn incense upon the altar of incense; Uzziah was wroth, had a censer in his hand to burn incense, and while he was wroth with the priests, the leprosy even rose up in his forehead, the priests thrust him out, and King

Uzziah was a leper unto the day of his death, dwelling in a several house, as a leper, for he was cut off from the house of the LORD, and Jotham his son judged the people of the land

8. Jotham; he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father Uzziah did; he entered not into the temple of the LORD

9. Ahaz; a bad king because he did not that which was right in the sight of the LORD but he walked in the ways of the kings of Israel, and made also molten images for Baalim; the LORD brought Judah low because of King Ahaz
