“For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ” (John 1:17).

Answers:

1. God would put enmity between them, and between their seed it shall bruise – God was promising to send Jesus who would defeat Satan

2. Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness

3. The gospel message of Jesus, saying, In thee (Jesus) shall all nations be blessed

4. As many as are of the works of the law are under the curse, no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, for the just shall live by faith, law is not of faith

5. Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, that through Jesus Christ, we might receive the promise through faith

6. There is no one that is righteous, all are sinners, no one seeks after God, there is no fear of God, and God’s Law is to show people just how guilty they are before God - For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.

7. The law is our schoolmaster to bring us unto Jesus, that we might be justified by the same faith of Abraham to whom it was given by promise.

8. The LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and man became a living soul; as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin, and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned because death reigned from Adam to Moses, because all had sinned

9. Just as sin came by one man, resurrection from the dead came by one man - for as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive; Jesus is able to make anyone who believes in Him alive again because He came and conquered death.
