Answers:

1. he was of the priests that were in Anathoth; he lived in the days of King Josiah until end of Zedekiah king of Judah, unto the carrying away of Jerusalem; the carrying away of Jerusalem;

God said, “Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations”; Jeremiah said, “I cannot speak: for I am a child.”; God told him to not say he was a child, for Jeremiah would go to all that God sends him and tell them what God said to tell them. God said to not be afraid for He was with him and He put His words in Jeremiah’s mouth;

3. God was going to call all of the families of the north (Babylon) to come against Jerusalem and Judah and God was going to utter His judgments against them for all their wickedness, those who has forsaken God, and had burned incense unto other gods, and worshipped the works of their own hands;

God said to speak all of His Words to them and do not be afraid for God would make Jeremiah like a defenced city, and an iron pillar, and brasen walls against the whole land, against the kings of Judah, against the princes thereof, against the priests thereof, and against the people of the land, and though they fight against Jeremiah, God would be with him to deliver him from the people;
