Answers:

- 1. how long shall I cry, and thou wilt not hear! even cry out unto thee of violence, and thou wilt not save;
- **2.** he saw iniquity, spoiling and violence, and those that raise up strife and contention, because of this the law is slacked, and judgment doth never go forth: the wicked compass about the righteous and wrong judgment proceeds;
- **3.** yes; God will work a work in Habakkuk's days, which he would not believe, though it be told him, God was going to raise up the Chaldeans to overcome Judah;
- **4.** Chaldeans are terrible and dreadful, horses also are swifter than the leopards, more fierce than the evening wolves, their horsemen shall spread themselves, and come from far, they shall fly as the eagle, they will come for violence, they shall gather the captivity as the sand, scoff at the kings, they shall deride every strong hold, and take it all;
- 5. yes; Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith. We are not to be proud, knowing it all, but trust in God knowing He knows all and knows what is best;
