Answers:

1. speak to the children of thy people;
2. to be a watchman unto the house of Israel, hear the word at God's mouth, and warn the people from God;
3. one that had escaped out of Jerusalem told Ezekiel, The city is smitten; so the people would then shall they know that God is the LORD, when He laid the land most desolate because of all the people's abominations which they committed;
4. They would be tilled and sown, the cities would be inhabited, and the wastes would be built, God would multiply them and would settle them after their old estates, and will do better to them than at their beginnings – and they shall know that He is the LORD
5. God poured His fury upon them for the blood that they had shed upon the land, and for their idols with which they had polluted it, and God scattered them among the heathen, and they were dispersed through the countries, for God judged them;
6. "the heathen shall know that I am the LORD, saith the Lord GOD, when I shall be sanctified in you before their eyes";
7. God told Ezekiel to preach to the dry, dead bones in the valley saying, "O ye dry bones, hear the word of the LORD." When Ezekiel obeyed and prophesied to them, the bones came together, then the sinews and the flesh came up upon them, and the skin covered them. God told Ezekiel to prophesy unto the wind, and when he did, the wind came, they lived, and stood up upon their feet, an exceeding great army; It meant that one day Israel would come together as a living nation again one day and they would recognize their God;
8. God would make them one nation in the land upon the mountains of Israel, and one king shall be king to them all, and they shall be no more two nations, neither shall they be divided into two kingdoms any more at all;
