Answers:

1. Belshazzar the king made a great feast to a thousand of his lords, drank wine, and commanded to bring the golden and silver vessels which his father Nebuchadnezzar had taken out of the temple which was in Jerusalem; fingers of a man's hand, and part of the hand that wrote;

2. Daniel; the writing that was written, MENE, MENE, TEKEL, UPHARSIN, first MENE meant God hath numbered thy kingdom, and finished it, then TEKEL meant thou art weighed in the balances, and art found wanting, finally, PERES meant thy kingdom is divided, and given to the Medes and Persians;

3. Belshazzar the king of the Chaldeans was killed and Darius the Median took the kingdom;

4. Daniel was preferred above the presidents and princes and the king thought to set him over the whole realm; the presidents and princes; All the presidents, the governors, the princes, the counsellors, and the captains, have consulted together to establish a royal statute, and to make a firm decree, that whosoever shall ask a petition of any God or man for thirty days, save the king, he shall be cast into the den of lions;

5. when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went into his house where his windows were open toward Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, prayed, and gave thanks before his God, as he did aforetime; no; the men went to the king, the king commanded, they brought Daniel, and cast him into the den of lions. They put a stone over the den and the king sealed it with his own signet, and with the signet of his lords;

6. God; the king commanded, and they brought those men which had accused Daniel, and they cast them into the den of lions, them, their children, and their wives. And the lions brake all their bones in pieces before they hit the bottom of the den;

7. That God's people would be in captivity (the desolations of Jerusalem) in Babylon for seventy years.
