5. a certain damsel possessed with a spirit of divination; Paul said to the spirit, "I command thee in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And he came out the same hour; at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God;

6. There was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken, and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed; the keeper of the prison; supposing that the prisoners had been fled for he was responsible for their lives;

7. "Do thyself no harm: for we are all here"; he asked, "What must I do to be saved?" He then believed and was baptized;
