Answers:

1. He reminded them that John verily baptized with the baptism of repentance, saying unto the people that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus; they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

2. About 2 years; all they which dwelt in Asia heard the word of the Lord Jesus, both Jews and Greeks;

3. There were seven sons of Sceva which tried to cast out evil spirits, and the man in whom the evil spirit was leaped on them, overcame them, and prevailed against them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. All the Jews and Greeks also dwelling at Ephesus heard, and fear fell on them all; The name of the Lord Jesus was magnified

4. The people brought their books together, burned them before all men, and counted the price of them, and found it fifty thousand pieces of silver; most likely because they wanted to live a new life pleasing God;

5. A young man named Eutychus fell into a deep sleep while Paul was preaching long, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up dead. Paul then declared he was alive, ate, preached some more and then left;

6. Luke; from house to house;

7. That they would see his face no more; after Paul's departing grievous wolves would enter in among them, not sparing the flock. Also that from among them shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them;

8. To not cry, for he was ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus
