### Answers:

- 1. Caesar; a ship of Adramyttium, by the coasts of Asia
- **2.** Julius, a centurion of Augustus' band; Julius courteously entreated Paul, and gave him liberty to go unto his friends to refresh himself;
- **3.** Paul perceived that this voyage would be with hurt and much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of their lives;
  - **4.** A tempestuous wind, called Euroclydon;
  - **5.** That all hope that they should be saved was taken away;
- **6.** To be of good cheer for there would be no loss of any man's life among them, only of the ship. Paul told them that the angel of God came to him and said, "Fear not, Paul, thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee"
  - 7. The centurion was willing to save Paul; they all escaped safe to land;
- **8.** When Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks, and laid them on the fire, a viper came out of the heat, and fastened on his hand. When the barbarians saw the viper hang on his hand, they said among themselves, "No doubt this man is a murderer, whom, though he hath escaped the sea, yet vengeance suffereth not to live." But Paul shook off the viper into the fire and felt no harm;
- **9.** Paul expounded and testified the kingdom of God, persuading them concerning Jesus, both out of the law of Moses, and out of the prophets, from morning till evening; some believed the things which were spoken, and some believed not;
- 10. Paul dwelt two whole years in his own hired house, and received all that came in unto him, preaching the kingdom of God, and teaching those things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ, with all confidence;
