Answers:

1. Paul could not believe that they had forgotten that salvation is by faith, not obeying the Old Testament Law; “If any *man* preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed”;

2. They entered secretly, without declaring why it was they were there;

3. Paul needed time to grow in Christ first. He recorded that he went to Arabia, alone, to learn about Jesus for three years – time for him to become grounded in God’s Word. Paul began to visit the churches like the ones he had once persecuted, giving his testimony, revealing what Jesus had done in his life. The people recognized what God had done in Paul’s heart and life.

4. “I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.”; It means that a Christian must die to their old flesh – daily. It is then imperative that that person chooses to live for Christ, understanding that it is not them living, but “Christ liveth in me.” It can only be done by Jesus.

5. Abraham was saved the same way every Christian is saved – by faith; for he believed God’s promise to send One through which “shall all nations be blessed.” That One was Jesus. Abraham looked forward, by faith, to Jesus coming. Today, we look back to the fact that Jesus came and believe by faith.

6. Stand fast in their freedom from the Law, and stay with pure doctrine of faith; They were enabled to love and serve one another; Christians are to listen to what the Spirit of God is telling us to do and choose to do the right thing in each situation and not listen to their old, sinful, flesh that tells us the wrong thing to do. Choose to do right;

7. Christians are not to do the works of the flesh that we may be tempted to do;

8. “The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance”;

9. These verses tell us to put the desires of the flesh to death, live in the Spirit, and walk in the Spirit. This is revealed when Christians allow the fruit of the Spirit to prosper in that life;

10. These verses reveal that each Christian will receive rewards in this life and the life to come, according to how they live for Jesus. We are to never become tired of living for Jesus.
