Answers:

1. Timothy's grandmother, Lois, and Timothy's mother Eunice, and Paul taught Timothy about Jesus;

2. Paul taught Timothy to remember the specific teachings about the sound (true, pure, uncorrupted) doctrine of the Gospel message of Jesus; The Holy Ghost dwells within each Christian to help;

3. Timothy could be strong, only through the strength in the grace that is in Christ Jesus;

4. Paul taught to endure hardness as a good soldier (in a moral sense in reference to the performance of duty), and to not become entangled with the affairs of this life because Jesus called him to be a soldier (a Christian minister), so Timothy was to obey God's Word, living a right life; This is important because each person needs to see and hear the Gospel truths taught and lived out in Christians' lives for salvation has been made available to anyone;

5. "If we be dead with *him*, we shall also live with *him*: If we suffer, we shall also reign with *him*: if we deny *him*, he also will deny us: If we believe not, *yet* he abideth faithful";

6. Christians are to study and know God's Word, then enabling them to discern between the truth of God's Word and false teaching;

7. "Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace ... But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strifes ...the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient"

8. When evil comes, Christians are to remember the Scriptures that have been learned, to continue in those things already learned and have been assured of from godly teachers who teach the Word of God;

9. Paul declared that his departure was at hand (he was about to die), and he was ready for he had fought a good fight and finished his course – Paul had kept the faith. Paul understood there was a crown of righteousness waiting for him and for all who love Jesus' appearing;
