Answers:

- 1. We are reminded of what the first seven chapters of Hebrews are about in that because Jesus is the high priest He became the minister, or servant, of God, fulfilling all of the duties required of the priest in heaven before God;
- 2. Every part of the tabernacle was built as a foreshadowing of things that were future and more perfect that revealed what Jesus would come and do. Because of what Jesus did, He became the mediator of a better covenant.
- 3. Candlestick: Jesus is the Light of the world; Table: representing fellowship with Jesus; Showbread: Jesus is the bread of Life; Veil separating the Holiest of all: upon Jesus' death on the cross, that veil was rent, indicating access into the dwelling place of God through Jesus; Golden censer (where sweet incense was offered): it represents the offering of sweet incense offered before the Lord:
- **4.** This tells that the sacrifice or man's sin will never have to be repeated, and Jesus will come again to take those who belong to Him into heaven with Him;
- **5.** Through Jesus, a Christian's sins are taken away, and God writes His law in their heart so Christians know what God expects of His people;
- **6.** These verses tell us that knowing we have been cleansed, we are to hold fast to our faith without wavering, encouraging other Christians in love, and to meet regularly with other Christians in church;
